






Oak Creek Canyon: The best way to Sedona is the 89A from Flagstaff, a two-lane highway with switch-backs, beautiful views and lots of tourists taking pictures and taking in the beauty! This is where Oak Creek Canyon sets in the edges of the Mogollon Rim. One of the main attractions for Oak Creek Canyon is Slide Rock State Park. The famous water chute and the swim spot created below the chute is one of the most popular summer destinations in Arizona. There are also some great hikes to take in the Oak Creek area, some of them being the Huckaby Trail, O' The Canyon Trailhead and Pumphouse Wash. Take the time to hike this beautiful area! Sedona: Sedona is surrounded by 1.8 million acres of national forest land. There are many recreational activities for visitors: trails for hiking and biking, jeep rides, beautiful pinnacles, spires, buttes and domes. Never far from downtown restaurants, galleries and shops, Sedona is equal parts rugged, equal parts resort. Regarded by Native Americans as sacred, Sedona continues to be recognized as a place of healing and spiritual renewal. Many come to experience the vortex energy centers or to browse the 40-plus art galleries, or to receive soothing treatments from the many spa facilities. Bell Rock: A popular tourist attraction just north of the Village of Oak Creek, Arizona, south of Sedona in Yavapai County. With an elevation at its summit of 4,919 feet (1,499 m), it is just west of Courthouse Butte.

Chapel of the Holy Cross: Designed by Frank Lloyd Wright student Marguerite Brunswig Staude, built in 1956 it rises 200 feet from the ground between two red rocks formations. The 90 foot cross can be seen from State Route 179 and is one of its most distinct features. The stained glass window reflects beautiful color during certain times of the day.

Tlaquepaque: Internationally renowned Tlaquepaque (pronounced T-la-keh-pah-keh), Sedona Arizona's Arts & Crafts Village, one of the best things to do in Sedona. Beneath the shade of the sycamores on the banks of beautiful Oak Creek in Sedona, Tlaquepaque is the most distinctive Sedona shopping experience to be found in the Southwest. Fashioned after a traditional Mexican village, Tlaquepaque, meaning the "best of everything," has been a Sedona landmark since the 1970's. Its vine covered stucco walls, cobble-stoned walkways and magnificent arched entryways give you the feeling that Tlaquepaque has been here for centuries. Tasteful galleries and unique shops near the giant sycamore trees is just part of the beauty of Tlaquepaque grounds.
